



#### **Anatomical Search**

Use your mouse to navigate over any of the boxed areas (outlined in blue) on the anatomical model (or "homunculus"). Within any of the boxed areas, a pop-up menu will open indicating the specialty areas included in your subscription to Procedures Consult. Clicking on the specialty area name then displays the procedures pertaining to that anatomical region alphabetically.



#### Selecting procedures from search results

Within the search results page, you then have one of three (3) options for viewing procedures content. Clicking on the link for any of the three will then open the relevant content page.

- Quick Review highly bulleted, summary content for quick reference

## Tests

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The page lists all tests alphabetically by procedure title, by test date, score, and grade (based on the required minimum passing core set by your program director. Click on any of the category headings at the top of the table to organize the list by that field. Click the link a second time to toggle it between ascending and descending order.

You can also search tests by due date using the drop down menus at the top of the page.

In addition, clicking on the name of a procedure will open the Quick Review page for that procedure.

Finally, you can elect to retake the test for any of the procedures listed on the screen by clicking the "Retake" link at the right of each entry on the list.

Note that on any page you can use the <u>Download</u> button in the upper right of the screen to export the data on the screen as a Microsoft Excel file. Upon clicking the button you will be prompted to designate whether you would like to open or save the file.





You can also use the Frint link also in the upper right of the screen to print the data on the screen at any time as well.

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The page lists the details of the assignment by procedure name, test date, score and grade. Click on any of the category headings at the top of the table to organize the list by that field. Click the link a second time to toggle it between ascending and descending order.

This page also indicated which tests you have not yet completed (indicated by "Not Taken" in the score column).

In addition, clicking on the name of any procedure will open the **Quick Review** page for that procedure.

Finally, you can elect to take or retake the test for any of the procedures listed on the screen by clicking the "Take" or "Retake" links at the right of each entry on the list.



## **Procedure Content**

There are three (3) types of content available for every procedure on Procedures Consult. They include:

- Quick Review highly bulleted, summary content for quick reference
- Full Details more comprehensive procedure content for in-depth review, including "clinical pearls" (which provide safety warnings as well as practical medical tips from experts) as well as a references section with active hyperlinks to evidence
- Test take the test for that procedure, including full remediation functionality

#### **Quick Review**

The **Quick Review** page for each procedure provides highly bulleted, summary content for quick reference. The Quick Review page is organized into three (3) sections, which is consistent for all procedures content on the site:

- Streaming video player (expert video) in the upper left of the screen
- Text and illustration content along the right side of the screen
- Testing and related links in the lower left of the screen



#### **Streaming Video Player**

The streaming video player allows you to review the expert video showing the procedure being performed. Procedures Consult utilizes streaming video technology, which allows for playback to begin before the video file is completely downloaded, providing quicker access to the content.

In addition, each procedure video is organized into key steps, allowing you to skip ahead to a specific section of the video without having to watch it in its entirety.

Finally, each video includes "clinical pearls" which provide safety warnings as well as practical medical tips from experts.



Key functional elements of the video player are as follows:

1. **Playback controls.** The radio buttons on the video player can be used to control playback of the video file.

From left to right:

- Play video
- Stop video playback
- Skip to previous key step
- Skip to next key step
- View closed captioning
- Toggle sound on / off
- Slider control to adjust sound (click and drag left to decrease volume, right to increase volume)
- 2. Video progress bar and time indicator. This includes the visual progress bar as well as the video elapsed / total time indicator. Note that you can click and drag the round indicator on the progress bar from left to right to dynamically navigate to any part of the video.
- 3. Video key steps. This section of the video player lists the key steps for that video file. Clicking on any of the numbered steps followed and then clicking the play button will allow you to navigate to each of the key steps in the video directly. Note the scroll bar along the right hand side of the section, which allows you to view longer lists of key steps which exceed the vertical space of the video key steps section.
- 4. Enlarge / Hide. Clicking the "Enlarge" link, a larger format version of the video (640 x 480) will open in a separate window. This larger video player has the same format and functionality as that described above. Clicking the "Hide" link will collapse the video player, increasing the size of the text / illustration window to facilitate review of the content. Clicking the "Show Video Column" button along the left side of the screen restores the video player to its default view within the user interface.



#### Step-by-step procedure text and illustration content

The text content for every procedure on Procedures Consult is organized into three (3) sections:

- Pre-Procedure including indications, contraindications, equipment and anatomy
- Procedure step-by-step instructions for performing the procedure itself
- Post-Procedure including post-procedure care, complications and analysis of results (if applicable)

The three buttons along the top of the screen (see below) allow you to navigate directly to any section of the procedure text content. Use your mouse to navigate over any of the boxes. Within any of the boxes, a pop-up menu will open indicating the sub-sections included. Clicking on the sub-section name then brings you to the start of that section within the frame of the text window.



Using the scroll bar at the right side of the text window also allows full navigation of the text content.

Clicking the View codes link in the upper right of the text window opens a separate window indicating the CPT and ICD-9 billing codes associated with that procedure for reference. Clicking the "Close" link in the upper right corner of the window closes the View codes window.

Clicking any of the illustrations or the "View larger image" link beneath each will open a larger format image of the illustration in a separate window, facilitating review of the images (particularly for tables as well as images with fine detail).

Finally, you can use the Frint link also in the upper right of the screen to print the full text content for the procedure at any time as well.

#### **Testing and related links**

Clicking the **"Take the test for this procedure"** link in the Testing and related links section of the screen in the lower left opens the interactive test for that procedure in a separate window.

	Rationale: A central line expedites delivery of chemotherapy and hyperosmolar agents and lessens the risk of vascular damage from them. Short-term emergency dialysis can be done through specialized central catheters, but long-term dialysis requires a more permanent access arrangement. Although blood drawn from a central catheter can allow measurement of mixed venous (or central venous) oxygen saturation, often used to estimate cardiac output, a stable patient can usually be evaluated with echocardiography rather than an invasive procedure.

#### **Full Details**



The **Full Details** page has the same user interface and functionality as the **Quick Review** page, as described above.


#### **Clinical Pearls**

Clicking on any of the blue superscript references throughout the Full Details text brings you to the beginning of the references section within the frame of the text window. Clicking the "**Return to Text**" link at the top of the references section returns you to the position in the text content where you clicked the superscript link.

Procedures Consult online help offers many search options, including:

To access the Table of Contents, click the **Contents** tab at the top of the help window. The Table of Contents opens in the left-hand pane. A book icon represents each section within the Table of Contents. Click on the book to view the topics listed within the section. Click the section a second time to close the section.

To access the Index, click the **Index** tab at the top of the help window. The Index opens in the lefthand pane along with an alphabetical list of keywords. You may search the Index by typing in a keyword and clicking Go. The Index window lists the topics associated with the keyword. Select a topic to display it in the main window.
